RAPS Requirements

- Volunteers must be at least 16 years of age. Volunteers under 19 years of age (B.C. age of Majority) must have a parent/guardian complete our Volunteer's Agreement co-signed by the volunteer
- Volunteers must be 19 years of age or older to volunteer without an adult.
- Volunteers under 19 years of age, but at least 16 years of age are required to be accompanied by an adult volunteer at every volunteer shift.
- Volunteers must be willing to undergo a criminal record check.
- Please bring picture ID with you to your volunteer orientation.
- Volunteers must sign the Volunteer's Agreement. Signing the agreement does not afford a right for Volunteer to be a volunteer at RAPS.
- Volunteering at RAPS is a privilege, not a right. RAPS reserves the RIGHT TO REFUSE any applicants from volunteering at RAPS' SOLE DISCRETION.
